FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Family and Friends of Grace UMC,

As the leaves continue to change color and fall, and the daylight grows smaller each day, we recognize the changing of seasons both in the world and in the church. We change our clocks this first weekend (fall back), which means evening walks will require safety measures earlier than before. November 2nd brings a service that includes remembering our saints we have lost in the last year: Ralph Rominger, Mabel Klenk, Lee Case, Robert Case, and Harriet Marple. We then have a few weeks before the end of the Christian Year (Christ the King/Reign of Christ Sunday), followed by Thanksgiving, and the beginning of the Christian year – Advent, the four weeks leading up to Christmas.

This year, perhaps more than other years, we recognize the darkness that can be felt by many. We continue to remember those

who have lost their jobs, been fired or laid off, furloughed or are working without being paid. Others also feel strain from losing food assistance and the possibility of affordable healthcare. It can feel overwhelming seeing all those in need and not knowing what can be done. One way we can help is to purchase items for those in need (getting them to an area food pantry), remembering that personal hygiene items are always needed too. Giving funds to our local pantries is another option. One of the most effective uses of one's money is to donate to the Regional Food Bank of Northeastern NY. Every dollar that is donated can provide 4 meals for a person in need. They are able to multiply the value of each dollar donated to provide more than any individual is able to. If you are looking for a more hands-on way to help, consider volunteering to sort through donations. With all that is going on in our world these days, it is easy to get overwhelmed and feel like things are hopeless or that there isn't anything that we can do to change it. Get together with people that bring joy to your life or find activities that get you out of your usual surroundings. Look for the good in the world – look for the helpers, the healers, the joyful; listen to music that feeds your soul; hang out in God's creation. Stay connected with God, even if it means wrestling with your faith, being frustrated with God, or just asking a lot of questions. God can handle it.

No matter what is happening in the world or in our own lives, we are not alone. We are never alone. Let us continue to put our faith and love into action and practice, as we become a people of grace.

Letter from Bishop Héctor A. Burgos Núñez

Dear partners in ministry,

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ.

Across our Episcopal Area, the government shutdown is straining food pantries, increasing demand, and stretching volunteers. Families are arriving in greater numbers, and the threat of SNAP benefit cuts will only deepen food insecurity.

In a recent <u>letter</u>, the Council of Bishops urged our government leaders to set aside partisanship and seek common ground for the sake of those they serve. We also called on United Methodists to respond with compassion and action.

Jesus said, "I was hungry and you gave me food" (Matthew 25:35). This is our call to embodied faith—loving boldly, serving joyfully, and leading courageously, meeting needs hand to hand.

I am grateful for the work already happening. Hundreds of churches in the Susquehanna and Upper New York Area offer and support food pantries where people find not only nourishment, but dignity and welcome.
