FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Family and Friends of Grace UMC,

Happy New Year! It's the end of 2025 and the beginning of 2026. Sometimes the new year can feel a bit scary, and other times it's bringing new challenges and opportunities. Often, it's a little bit of both! Whatever the new year brings, we know that we do not go alone. We have Emmanuel, God is with us, in whatever challenges and opportunities that come our way.

Our year begins with Epiphany, a celebration of light and the interaction of the Magi, Jesus, and his parents. Over the past few years, we have done Star Words – a word that is given for each person that can help set your intention for the new year. We will continue this practice – so if you would like to have your own word for this year, let me know by Jan 4th and I will send you one.

I will be taking a week off (5th - 11th), but our leadership will be taking over worship for a Wesley Covenant worship (11th). The Covenant Renewal Service was introduced by John Wesley in 1775 as a means for Methodists to gather for self-examination, reflection, and dedication to God. While the original liturgy has undergone revisions, its core purpose remains intact: to provide a meaningful opportunity for believers to reaffirm their faith and commitment to God.

The last two Sundays of January, we'll delve into Jesus' baptism (and an opportunity to reaffirm your own baptismal vows) and the start of his public ministry as he gathers his disciples. We recall our own calling into discipleship and how God calls each of us to different aspects of helping to create the kin-dom of God.

Change is happening all around us. Our district administrative assistant retired last year and our District Superintendent Debbie Earthrowl will be retiring from that position at the end of June. I invite you to pray for Joanna, the new District AA, and for the Cabinet, as we await their decision about who will replace Debbie at the end of her term.

One last prayer request – The Blisses, the Gordons and I met with the New York State Housing Authority and the architect, et al. in late December and ask that you continue to prayerfully wait for updates. God is indeed doing a new thing!

May we continue to work together to put our faith and love into action and practice.

PS: Please let me know if you are interested in a Bible or book study in the coming year and/or having a sermon(s) on specific topics. I have one book, *The Bible: What We Get Right (and Wrong) about Scripture's Most Controversial Issues*, that a couple of people are interested in reading. 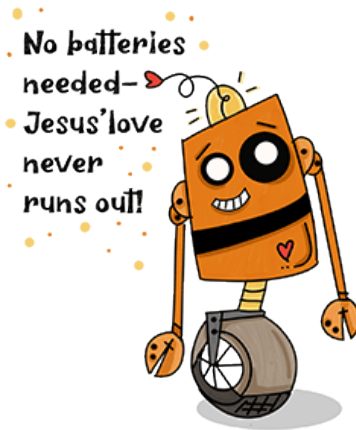
